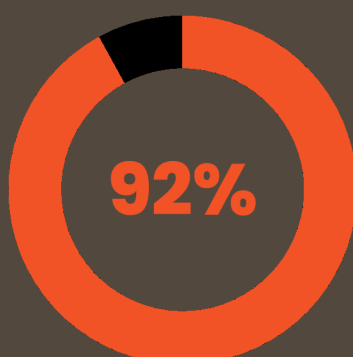

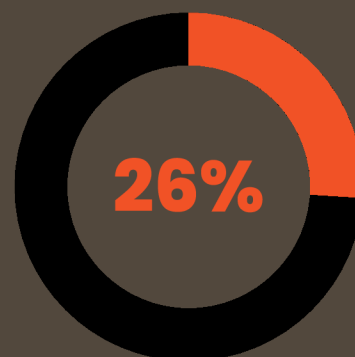

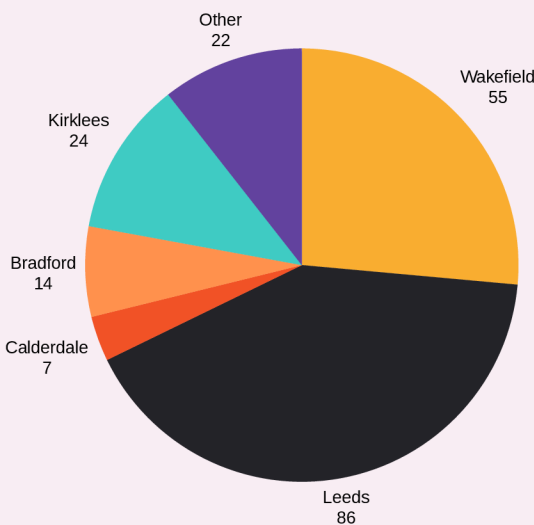


Average overall score of the session

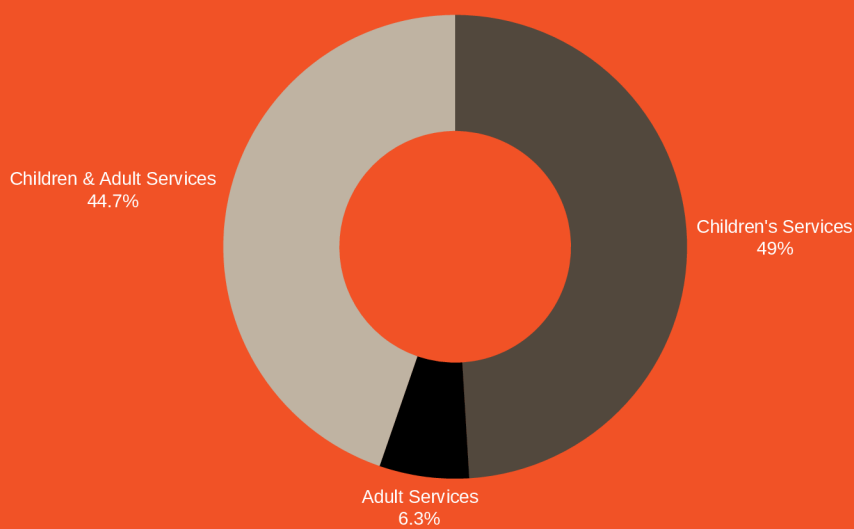


Attendees from services in Wakefield

- I will encourage parents to seek help and or advice around any changes in their children's behaviour where they suspect that there may be violence involved
- We have a couple of students who have been absconding from home, the course has highlighted that the seriousness of implications that need to be stressed on referral forms in the hope that they will be picked up
- Present and share to others - working with trauma informed schools this year fits in with what we are doing
