What services will do next

- Be more vigilant to the signs of exploitation
- Share information about the Partnership Intelligence Portal (PIP) within their teams to raise awareness
- Ensure their team has sufficient access to submit intelligence via the portal
- Share and engage with the content and resources on the Knowledge Hub
- Make use of the downloadable information and posters on the Knowledge Hub to share within the community
- Share resources and display posters in the youth hubs.
- Encourage families to report intelligence to Crimestoppers where they wish to remain anonymous
- Share this knowledge with foster carers and other agencies
- Improve the quality of submissions when submitting intelligence via the PIP
